2007 PRESIDENT GLORIA MACAPAGAL-ARROYO AWARD OF OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARD

To: Bureau and Regional Directors
Schools Division/City Superintendents
Heads, Public and Private Secondary Schools

- 1. In recognition of the outstanding achievements of students in the secondary level in academics and in five areas of co-curricular participation, the Office of the President and the Department of Education will confer the 2007 President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo (PGMA) Award of Outstanding Achievement and Academic Excellence Award during graduation rites to deserving students of public and private secondary schools across the country.
- 2. The 2007 President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo (PGMA) Award of Outstanding Achievement consists of five categories namely: student leadership, campus journalism, athletics, culture and arts, and technology and entrepreneurship. As such, there shall be a total of five awardees for Outstanding Achievement and at least one awardee for the 2007 President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo (PGMA) Academic Excellence Award per school.
- 3. The following shall guide the selection of the student-awardees:

a. Student Leadership

The 2007 PGMA Award of Outstanding Achievement for Student Leadership shall be given to the student who has shown active involvement in school organizations as an officer, particularly the supreme student government and other clubs and organizations. The student must have exhibited notable performance in implementing programs and projects and in delivering services for the school and the nearby community.

b. Campus Journalism

The 2007 PGMA Award for Outstanding Achievement for Campus Journalism shall be given to the student with the most outstanding achievement in the school paper, other organs or journals and who has exhibited the proper ethics, skills and talents in the various fields of journalism, and who has brought prestige and honor to the school through various competitions and exposures.

c. Athletics

The 2007 PGMA Award for Outstanding Achievement for Athletics shall be given to the most outstanding athlete of the school in whatever sport or combination of sports, whether competitive or not, and who exemplifies the ideals of healthy and honorable sportsmanship, and who has brought pride and honor to the school.

d. Culture and Arts

The 2007 PGMA Award for Outstanding Achievement for Culture and Arts shall be given to the most outstanding student who has manifested excellence in the field of arts, whether it be visual (painting, sculpture, design or graphic), performance (dance, theater or music) or literary (poetry or prose), and who has brought prestige and honor to the school through competitions and other exposures outside the school.

e. Technology and Entrepreneurship

The 2007 PGMA Award for Outstanding Achievement for Technology and Entrepreneurship shall be given to the outstanding student who excelled in the field of Technology and Livelihood Education (TLE). The student must have been an active participant in skills trainings/competitions (STEP) and/or have shown great potentials in entrepreneurial endeavors (YECS).

f. Academic Excellence

The 2007 PGMA Academic Excellence Award shall be given to the Valedictorian/s of the graduating batch.

- 4. The PGMA Award of Outstanding Achievement is in the nature of an open competition focusing on total achievement in each category notwithstanding the performance in academic work nor the year level of the student. It shall be in the form of a Special Certificate, placed in a specially-designed certificate holder, with the seal of the President prominent in the design and with the signature of both the President of the Philippines and the Secretary of Education. The PGMA Academic Excellence Award is an automatic award which shall be in the form of a medallion on which the seal of the President is engraved and marked appropriately.
- 5. The School Principal and all subject area Department Heads shall form themselves into a committee to select the five awardees, the names of which shall be submitted to the respective Division Offices for consolidation and reporting to the Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA) c/o Executive Director Joey G. Pelaez, with address at the Ground Floor, Mabini Bldg., DepED Complex, Meralco Avenue, Pasig City or website **www.deped-csca.com**. The DepED shall in turn furnish the Office of the President thru Undersecretary Mona Dumlao-Valisno a copy of the reports.
- 6. The awards shall be presented and given during the graduation ceremonies. Henceforth, the Regional and Division Offices shall initiate the immediate distribution of the certificates and medallions to all secondary schools nationwide before all graduation ceremonies are held.
- 7. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Order is directed.
