It prepares teachers to develop artistic processes that would help them seek out and solve pedagogical issues by using critical thinking and innovate approaches for the K to 12 curriculum and the challenges that its forthcoming implementation presents.

- 1. In support of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Cultural Center of the Philippines (CCP) and the Department of Education (DepEd), which was signed on September 23, 2016, "... to collaboratively undertake trainings and other relevant activities for the K to 12 Program" and "... to support the K to 12 Arts and Design Trainings and other relevant activities that CCP may undertake for the K to 12 programs through the issuance of memoranda..." the CCP, through its Arts Education Department will conduct series of workshops under the 2017 CCP Summer Arts Academy, for teachers of Senior High School (SHS) Arts and Design Track and the Special Program in the Arts (SPA) from April 4 to May 26, 2017 at the CCP and in selected workshop venues in the National Capital Region.
- 2. The 2017 CCP Summer Arts Academy is specially designed to provide teachers (nonbeginners) with specialized training on their respective art forms, to build their capacities and advance their level of art literacy, production techniques and processes. Only 30 teachers shall participate per module.
- 3. Preference will be given to teacher-applicants who are actively engaged with creative, artistic and management production or activities or who are actively engaged in mentoring or coaching of students in the arts, for recent competitions such as National Music Competition for Young Artists (NAMCYA), National Festival of Talents (NFOT), and other national and international competitions or exhibits in the different art field.
- 4. The 2017 CCP Art Academy shall consist of workshops and training modules to be facilitated by artist-teachers and practitioners from the CCP Resident Companies and partners. The modules include the following:

- ii. artistic work of students in the arts where teacher was mentor or coach for recent competitions such as NAMCYA; National Festival of Talents, and other recognized national or international competitions or exhibits in the different art fields, to be submitted:
 - 1. in video mpeg4 or DVD format; or
 - 2. as an upload to youtube, among others, providing the URL address or corresponding link.
- c. List and contact number of artists and artist groups the teachers worked with, for reference purposes.
- 7. Deadline for submission of application and portfolio:
 - a. Early registrations (early birds): March 1, 2017
 - b. Regular schedule: March 15, 2017
- 8. Notification of accepted applicants:
 - a. Early registrations (early birds): March 10, 2017
 - b. Regular schedule: March 24, 2017
 - c. No walk-ins shall be allowed to register
- 9. Each accepted applicant shall be charged a registration fee of **Three Thousand** Five **Hundred Pesos** (P 3,500.00) for workshop kits, training laboratory use and materials for the duration of the workshop for the participants.
 - a. Registration, transportation, board and lodging and other expenses shall be charged to school MOOE/division/region Funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations;

Workshop 201: Creative Industries 2- Performing Arts

Resource Person: Dr. Elizabeth Susan Vista-Suarez, Prof. Mathilda Limbaga-Erojo, and Juni Jay Tinambacan Prof. Mark Ian A. Cabballes (2-hr/session)

Description: This class offers exploratory study of local music genre and information and communication technologies (ICT) applications in music while deepening the musical skills and understanding vocal and choral techniques. It also gives opportunity to perform on an ensemble and learn various methods of producing music.

Workshop 202: Creative Industries 2- Dance

Resource Person: Ronnie Mirabuena, Cheenee Vasquez Limuaco, and Jonee Jabez (2-hr/session)

Description: This class will teach and immerses students in their chosen strand, specifically the dance strand, giving them practical and hands-on experience with choreography, including working with local artist and /or a performing arts group or arts organization. The program culminates in a dance production.

Workshop 203: Creative Industries 2- Theater

Resource Persons: Abner Delina, Jr. & Dessa Quesada-Palm (2-hr/session)

Description: This class will be guided through a dynamic professional development and given hands-on opportunities by either placing them with practicing artists or organizations with resident artists who can administer on-the-job mentoring and training. The students may also opt to put up their own show under the guidance of a director or an experienced theater practitioner.

Workshop 204: Creative Industries 1- Arts and Design Appreciation and Production Resource Person: Gerry Leonardo, Lino Magtalang, Jr. & Dr. Ted Padova (2-hrs/session)

Description: The class will presents a survey of the various arts and design production for senior secondary students. It intends to provide students with knowledge of the different arts and design forms, materials, media and production in the creative industries. It will also introduce significant and influential artists and their works across time and place.

Workshop 204: Apprenticeship and Exploration in Arts Production (Visual Arts and Media Arts)

Resource Person: Gerry Leonardo, Lino Magtalang, Jr. & Dr. Ted Padova (2-hrs/session)

Description: The class offers an intensive period of acquiring, understanding, and developing proficiency in visual arts and design production through hands-on training in available art organizations, art centers, production houses, independent artists/designers, community-based art/cultural groups. It intends to enrich the learner's knowledge and skills in his/her chosen field emphasizing artistic, educational and cultural values and work ethics.

Workshop 205: Apprenticeship & Exploration in Arts Production (Literary Arts)
Resource Person: Ian Rosales Casocot (2-hr/session)

Description: This class offers an acquisition of skills for creative writing and writing for mass media. It seeks to expose the learner various types of writing and literary genres, offering a wide range of career options.

Description: This class demonstrates an understanding of the different theater skills, its characteristics, specificities, specialization, and demands, as well as its contribution to the context of local development of a theatrical production. It also introduce Acting/Performance, Voice for theater, Movement for theater, Acting principles and methods.

Workshop 209: Apprenticeship and Exploration in Arts Production (Visual Arts and Applied Arts)
