WAGE ORDER NO. ROVII-25

PROVIDING FOR A MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE IN REGION - VII

WHEREAS, the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board – VII is mandated under Republic Act No. 6727, otherwise known as the Wage Rationalization Act, to periodically assess wage rates and conduct continuing studies in the determination of the minimum wage applicable in the region or industry;

WHEREAS, the current Wage Order No. ROVII-24 took effect on October 1, 2023;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3(A), Rule II of the Omnibus Rules on Minimum Wage Determination, (Omnibus Rules) as amended, in the absence of any petition for a minimum wage adjustment filed, the Board may motu proprio, initiate wage review;

WHEREAS, the Board conducted a series of consultations from June 21 to July 25, 2024 and upon deliberation during its meeting on July 25, 2024, motu proprio, decided to commence the minimum wage determination process and review the current minimum wage rates;

WHEREAS, after due notice to all stakeholders, the Board conducted a series of public hearings to assess and determine the propriety of issuing a new wage order which was attended by business associations/chambers/organizations, labor groups, media, micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), and private citizens on the following dates:

WHEREAS, in setting the minimum wage, the Board must consider the various criteria provided under Republic Act No. 6727, as well as the procedures laid down in the Omnibus Rules, as amended;

WHEREAS, after a thorough review and evaluation of the existing socio-economic conditions in the region, the following were established:

- a. Consumer Price Index (CPI) in the region was at 118,00 in October 2023 and rose to 121.9 in July 2024;
- The average inflation rate from the effectivity of the last wage increase on October 1, 2023 up to August 2024 is 3.65%;
- c. The purchasing power of the peso at the time of wage order effectivity was at PhP 0.847 in October 2023 and has gone down to PhP 0.83 in August 2024;

- d. The 2023 poverty threshold for a family of five (5) in the region, which is the latest available data provided by the Philippine Statistics Authority, is in the amount of PhP 473.00;
- e. The Gross Regional Domestic Product (GRDP) Growth Rate of Central Visayas is at 7.3% for 2022 to 2023; and
- f. The Labor Productivity Growth Rate in Central Visayas for 2022 to 2023 is at 4.3%.

WHEREAS, in adherence to NWPC Resolution No. 04, Series of 2024, enjoining the RTWPBs to observe regular review of wage classifications to ensure consistency with socioeconomic demographics, the Board agreed to simplify the wage rates classifications in the region by merging non-agriculture and agriculture and non-agriculture with less than 10 employees resulting in a single wage rate for each geographical classification.

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the power and authority vested under Republic Act No. 6727, RTWPB - VII hereby issues this Wage Order.

Section 1. Amount of Increase. Upon effectivity of this Wage Order, minimum wage earners in the private sector in the Region shall receive a PhP 33.00 - PhP 43.00 basic increase per day.

Section 2. New Minimum Wage Rates. The new daily minimum wage rate/s in Region VII shall be as follows:

Section 3. Basis of Minimum Wage Rates. The minimum wage rates prescribed under this Order shall be for the normal working hours which shall not exceed eight (8) hours of work a day.

Section 4. Covered. The wage increase prescribed hereinshall apply to all minimum wage earners in the private sector within the region, regardless of their position, designation or status and irrespective of the method by which their wages are paid.

Section 5. Exemption. The following establishments may apply for exemption from compliance with this Wage Order, as provided under Rule VII of the Omnibus Rules, as amended:

- a. Retail/Service establishments regularly employing not more than ten (10) workers; and
- b. Establishments adversely affected by natural calamities and/or human-induced disasters.

Section 6. Penal Provision. Any person, corporation, trust, firm, partnership, association or entity which refuses or fails to pay the prescribed increase shall be dealt with pursuant to the provisions of Section 12 of Republic Act No. 6727, as amended by RA No. 8188.

Section 7. Effectivity. This Wage Order shall take effect after fifteen (15) days from its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.

WHEREAS, after due notice to all stakeholders, the Board conducted the following wage consultations and public hearing to assess and determine the propriety of issuing a new wage order;

WHEREAS, existing socio-economic conditions in the region, as well as the positions of the affected sectors on the wage issue were considered.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the power and authority vested to RTWPB – II under *RA No. 6727*, this Wage Order is hereby issued.

Section 1. Amount of Increase. Upon effectivity of this Wage Order, minimum wage earners in the private sector in the Region shall receive a P30.00 basic increase per day;

Section 2. New Minimum Wage Rates. The new daily minimum wage rates in Region - II shall be as follows:

Section 3. Basis of Minimum Wage Rates. The minimum wage rates prescribed under this Order shall be for the normal working hours which shall not exceed eight (8) hours of work a day.

Section 4. Covered. The wage increase prescribed herein shall apply to all minimum wage earners in the private sector within the region, regardless of their position, designation or status and irrespective of the method by which their wages are paid.

Section 5. Penal Provision. Any person, corporation, trust, firm, partnership, association or entity which refuses or fails to pay the prescribed increase shall be dealt with pursuant to the provisions of *Section 12 of RA No. 6727, as amended by RA No. 8188.*

Section 6. Effectivity. This Wage Order shall take effect after fifteen (15) days from its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
