This is in accordance with regulations, which stipulate that any company intending to manufacture, import, export, distribute, sell, offer for sale, transfer, promote, or advertise must secure an LTO prior to engaging in these activities. This requirement should be explicitly stated in the Bid Bulletin.

Was this requirement carefully evaluated during the market survey and pre-procurement planning?

While the FDA's Product Notification ensures that toys meet certain safety standards, PNS ISO 8124 provides a comprehensive set international safety guidelines specifically designed to protect children. We believe that these two certifications complement each other and together provide a higher level of assurance regarding the safety and quality of toys. PNS Removing the ISO 8124 requirement may inadvertently lower the safety standards. Therefore, we seek vour clarification on whether maintaining both requirements would be more beneficial for ensuring the safety of educational materials.

This consistency in thickness would enhance the durability and uniformity of the lacing cards, making them more practical for repeated use.

Completing the procurement process for a project valued at 2.9 billion pesos within less than 30 days is highly challenging. We are compelled to ask: Is this the standard procedure for DepEd's major projects, such as the DepEd Computerization Program (DCP) and Learning Resources procurement? Or are there preferred bidders who have had the advantage of preparing for this project months, if not years, in advance?

101. Section V. Special Conditions of the Contract: The designated delivery sites, as per DDP, are stated to be at the "Public Schools District Offices." Does this imply that deliveries will be made exclusively to the District Offices and not directly to the individual public schools within those districts? Kindly confirm.

102. Section VII. Technical Specification: The FDA-TCCA notifications are required per unique item, which varies based on measurement, color, and Stock Keeping Unit (SKU) number. The timeline for manufacturing according to your specifications, followed by the safety testing and FDA-TCCA notification process, significantly disadvantages bidders who were only made aware of these requirements upon the bid posting. This stands in stark contrast to those who may have had advance notice and were able to submit exact items for testing months ago. We strongly urge that this requirement be either removed or only imposed on the lowest calculated bidder before delivery can commence.

103. As per consultation with the toys manufacturers with regards to the detailed Technical Specifications:

For items 2&3:

Pattern blocks and Lacing beads (Wood); we noticed that the sizes of the figures are too small at l"x1" to 1.25" that are dangerous for Kindergarten students if swallowed.

Retained minimum technical specifications due to the following reasons:

- A similar project was previously procured twice without problems following the same minimum technical specifications.
- Changes in the technical specifications will entail additional testing process, may delay the procurement.

For items 6&7:

Uppercase and lowercase alphabets; if all uppercase (except N and NG - larger) and lowercase letters a, c, e, m, n, o, r, s, u, v, w, x, z have a minimum size of 1.5" x 1.5" and the remaining lowercase letters: b, d, f, g, h, i, j, k, 1, ñ, ng, p, q, t, y will have larger sizes - what will be the minimum size of b, d, f, g, h, i, j, k, l, ñ, ng, p, q, t, y? If it will be larger than 1.5" x 1.5" - the sizes are not proportion to the rest of the uppercase and lowercase. May we request for a detailed answer and dimensions on this matter.

For items 8&9:

Shape Lacing Cards and Picture Puzzle 10 Kinds; may we suggest using plywood in the Shape Lacing Cards and Picture Puzzles instead of a kiln-dried solid wood. Cutting a solid wood with a thickness of 4mm or 0.15inch in puzzle sizes (irregular shapes) and lacing cards will result to more wastage due to prone of wood breakage and it will incur expensive costing. Plywood is more durable to use in this kind of shapes and puzzle because of its binding materials. Plywood can be easily shaped and cut by the machine for mass production and not solid woods.
