## F. Actions Taken

### 1. Central Office

- Convened online the affected regions and divisions and DepEd CO DRRM Team for the immediate conduct of field assessment.
- Provided agency updates during Response Cluster Meetings with the NDRRMC;
- Sent trigger for Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADaR) to affected areas;
- Monitored the impacts of hazards in affected regions and divisions; and
- Disseminated Weather Advisories to affected regions and divisions, DepEd Quick Response and Recovery Team (QRRT), and Education Cluster Partners.
- Deployed DRRMS personnel for the ongoing field assessment in the affected schools due to flooding
- Activated RADaR reporting
- Deployed and disseminated IEC materials on flooding-related hazards e.g. leptospirosis.
- Conducted online orientation to all schools nationwide on DO 33, s 2021 and DO 37, s. 2022
- AOR Leads are continuously monitoring
- Readily available prepositioned funds for Clean-up and clearing operations, minor repair, and other response interventions, as needed

- Disseminate Weather Advisories and Tropical Cyclone Bulletin Information in divisions and schools.

## G. Next Steps and Recommendations

- Conduct school visits to Regions II and III with the Quick Response and Recovery Team of the Central Office from July 29 to August 2, 2024
- Conduct the vetting of the Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADaR) that will be the basis of the provision of response interventions in the regional level
- Facilitate the request of division offices for response interventions, such as, Clean-up and Clearing Operations, Minor Repair, and/or Temporary Learning Spaces
- Conduct immediate assessment of damaged school buildings for the endorsement to Bureau of the Treasury for funding under the National Indemnity Insurance Program
- Conduct Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services (MHPSS) including Psychological First Aid (PFA) in the first week of the opening of classes.
- Provide teachers' kits, learners' kits, and/or hygiene kits, as needed
- Endorse RADaR 2 to the Education Facilities Division, Bureau of Learning Resources, and Information and Communications Technology Service for detailed assessment and replacement of damaged non-infrastructure items
- Mobilize Education Cluster Partners for other response interventions
